Parking

- To be considerate of our neighbors, please do not park in the residential area.
- Please do not double park.
- ➤ When parking in the outdoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2), please be careful not to block the emergency exits and keep a distance of 3 feet from the building's exterior wall so that the emergency exit doors can be fully opened.
- Please park and lock your bike/e-bike outside. Do not park the bike inside the building.

- 6. What attributes of God are revealed through Jesus' healing ministry?
- 7. In Jesus' healing stories, those who were healed believed in His power before receiving healing. How do these stories challenge your own faith and trust in God?
- 8. Jesus' healing demonstrates God's power to restore what is broken. Where do you see brokenness in today's world? Does the Gospel of the Kingdom give you hope? Why?
- 9. Have you ever experienced God's healing and restoration in your life—physically, emotionally, spiritually, or in relationships?
- 10. In your current situation, is there something you long for God to heal? How do you hope He will heal you?
- 11. As disciples of Christ, we are called to partner with God in bringing restoration to the world. How can we practically help those around us experience physical, emotional, or spiritual healing?
