Scripture Reading Plan

- ▶ In Chapters 1-7, it reflects Paul's vulnerable defence of his apostleship through suffering, humility, and Christlike love. The Corinthians had been swayed by more impressive leaders and grew ashamed of Paul's weakness and poverty. Paul counters by reframing weakness through the paradox of the cross: true glory is revealed in self-giving love and sacrificial service. He invites them into a "new covenant" relationship empowered by the Spirit, not written on tablets but on transformed hearts. Read these chapters as Paul models forgiveness, authenticity, and the power of suffering to reflect Christ's glory. Let his words challenge your views of success and leadership.

Icebreaking

1. If you knew you were living your last day, what would you lower in importance that you currently hold as important?

Know

- 2. Please review your sermon notes for this week. What did you learn that you did not know previously?
- 3. Read together again 2Corinthians 4:1-18. What impression does this passage give you? What is the most intriguing saying in this passage to you? Why?
- 4. What does Paul mean when he says "we do not lose heart" (vv.1, 16)? Why does he repeat it?
- 5. What is the significance of Paul calling himself a "jar of clay" in verse 7?
- 6. Why does Paul reject worldly definitions of success in ministry?
- 7. How is God's power revealed through human weakness, according to this passage?
- 8. What does Paul contrast between "seen" and "unseen," "temporary" and "eternal" (v.18)?

Feel

- 9. When have you felt like "a jar of clay"—fragile, plain, or inadequate? How did God meet you there?
- 10. What specific discouragement are you carrying now? How does this passage speak into it?
- 11. How does knowing that even death cannot stop God's mission affect your fears or anxieties?
- 12. How do you feel about being "not the treasure," but a vessel carrying the treasure of Christ?

Plan

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to prioritize "revealing Christ" over success? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

Do

- 14. Resolve to prioritize "revealing Christ" over success?. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 15. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 16. Commit to prioritize "revealing Christ" over success?. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
