Scripture Reading Plan

- ▶ 2 Corinthians ch.9 continues Paul's call to the Corinthian church to give generously in support of the believers in Jerusalem. In chapters 10–13, he defends his apostleship, warns against false apostles, and humbly shares his hardships and weaknesses, urging Corinthians to find true strength in Christ. Paul's deep love for the Corinthians is evident—he grieves and weeps for them, longing for their repentance and obedience to Christ, which would fill him with joy.
- ► Romans was written by Paul during his stay in Corinth, addressed to the believers in Rome. Romans Ch.1–2 lay the theological foundation of the letter, proclaiming the gospel as God's power for the

- salvation of all who believe. Paul makes clear that all people, Jew and Gentile alike, are under sin and without excuse, and that justification comes only through faith.

- 4. What does the widow of Zarephath's story in 1 Kings 17 teach us about generosity in scarcity?
- 5. How does the preacher contrast the "economy of scarcity" with the "order of the Kingdom of Heaven"?
- 6. What does it mean that generosity is "not based on abundance but faith"?
- 7. How does generosity "enlarge the harvest of righteousness" according to 2 Corinthians 9:10?

Feel

- 8. When you think about giving in times of scarcity, what emotions arise in you—fear, joy, anxiety, or trust? Why?
- 9. What feelings surface when you realize that hoarding resources can lead to anxiety rather than security?
- 10. How does imagining God's abundant provision affect your feelings toward sharing what you have?
- 11. Have you ever experienced a moment when generosity brought you unexpected joy or blessings?
- 12. What is one area of your life—other than finances—where God might be calling you to be more generous?

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to intentionally resist the "economy of scarcity" mindset in your daily decisions? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

Do

- 14. Resolve to intentionally resist the "economy of scarcity" mindset in your daily decisions. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 16. Commit to intentionally resist the "economy of scarcity" mindset in your daily decisions. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
