Parking

Scripture Reading Plan

- ▶ This week, we'll continue reading 1 Corinthians.
- ▶ Paul founded the church in Corinth during one of his missionary journeys (Acts 18). After planting more churches, he received a concerning report about Corinth's state (1 Corinthians 1:11). The people were dividing into groups with varying leaders, engaging in casual sex, questioning the morality of eating food offered to idols, getting drunk at church gatherings, and even denying the resurrection. Paul responded with a stern letter (that is 1 Corinthians), urging repentance and reformation. However, many in the church rejected his words and continued to live as if Paul had no authority. They even resorted to personal attacks against him.
- ➤ As you read 1 Corinthians this week, imagine how you would respond if those stern words were directed at you, and why.

Small Group Discussions

- 1. What aspects of following Jesus feel most natural and unnatural to you?
- 2. What was an impactful event in your life that formed who you are today?
- 3. Review the sermon notes you wrote this week. (If some group members haven't heard this week's sermon, consider listening to the recording together during the group and taking notes.)
- 4. Why is Christ the unshakable foundation for our faith and service?
- 5. What do "gold, silver, and precious stones" and "wood, hay, and straw" symbolize? Do these metaphors point to our motives, methods, or results—and why?
- 6. According to Scripture, why will a person's ministry or work, even if seemingly successful in the eyes of others, be "burned up" if it is not built on Jesus Christ?
- 7. Have you ever doubted whether you are building on the right foundation? What did you discern through that?
- 8. In your spiritual life or ministry, have you ever felt hurt or discouraged because of others' judgments or misunderstandings? How does this passage encourage you?
- 9. Have you ever experienced God personally restoring a relationship that you once thought could not be healed?
- 10. How can I be more intentional about facing people and situations with grace and sincerity?
- 11. Reflect on how I can cultivate a culture that allows room for disagreement while still preserving unity.
- 12. Have you ever served with the wrong motives (e.g., comparison, people-pleasing)? What kind of "materials" (such as time, relationships, attitude) do you plan to use to build your spiritual life and Christ's church?
- 13. What are a few specific things you can do to make sure you are building on the foundation of Christ?
- 14. How can you encourage or help a discouraged brother or sister return to the work of building a spiritual life?
- 15. Invite one group member to hold you accountable—permit them to challenge you when you are not staying committed to your intentions.
