- ► In Antioch, disciples scattered by persecution began preaching to Gentiles, establishing the first multicultural church.
- Amid turmoil and challenges, the Holy Spirit continued to strengthen the community and advance the kingdom of God.

Co·Mission 30. Becoming a Healing Community [Act 3:1-21]

Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." [Acts 3:6]

Sermon Outline

Introduction:

Main idea: Some interruptions are actually invitations to be healed An Ordinary Day, a Hurting Man

Text: Acts 3:1-3

- ▶ Peter and John head to the temple at the hour of prayer
- ▶ A man is carried daily to beg outside the gate
- ► Sometimes we've learned to survive in our brokenness
- ► Key thought: Healing begins with presence—not power
- ▶ Challenge: Are we willing to slow down and see those who are hurting?

In the Name of Jesus, Walk

Text: Acts 3:4-8

- Peter commands healing—not by his own strength, but in Jesus' name
- ▶ The man is lifted up and strengthened immediately
- ► Key thought: Jesus' name still carries authority and healing power
- ▶ Quote (R.C. Sproul): "The power was in the name of Jesus, who is the power of God incarnate."

Walking, Leaping, Praising

Text: Acts 3:8-10

- ► The healed man responds with joy and enters the temple
- ► His healing becomes public testimony
- ► Key thought: When Jesus heals, He doesn't just fix what's broken—He restores what was lost
- ▶ Quote (David Peterson): "Healing in the name of Jesus restores people to God and to His people."

My Reflection

► What did God tell me through the message today?

The Name, the Blame, and the Invitation

Text: Acts 3:11-16

- ▶ Peter explains the miracle and confronts the crowd
- ▶ Jesus, the Author of life, was rejected—but God raised Him up
- ▶ Key thought: Confrontation is an act of grace when it leads to truth
- ▶ Quote (David Peterson): "The emphasis is on the power and authority of Jesus to bring restoration."

Repent··· So That Refreshing May Come

Text: Acts 3:17-21

- ▶ Peter offers hope through repentance and restoration
- ▶ "Times of refreshing" promised for all who turn to God
- ► Key thought: The invitation isn't just forgiveness—it's renewal
- ▶ Romans 8:22–23: "Creation groans…"—we long for healing, too
- ▶ Quote (R.C. Sproul): "The healing of the lame man is a window into the ultimate restoration…"

Conclusion

- ▶ Don't settle for coins when Jesus offers wholeness
- ▶ Repentance leads to life, and His name still heals today
- ► Final call: Rise. Turn. Be refreshed. In Jesus' name.

Challenge

- ▶ What area of your life needs healing—physically, emotionally, spiritually?
- ▶ Where is Jesus inviting you to rise and walk with Him?

Small Group Discussions

- 1. Have you ever experienced a moment that interrupted your routine in a meaningful or spiritual way? What happened—and how did it shape you?
- 2. When you think of healing, what comes to mind first? (Physical? Emotional? Spiritual? Something else?)
- 3. Read Acts 3:1–10. What details in the story stand out to you? Why do you think Peter tells the man, "Look at us"?
- 4. What does this passage teach us about the power and authority of Jesus' name? What makes that name different from everything else people trust in?
- 5. Read Acts 3:11–16. Why do you think Peter chooses to confront the crowd so directly? What's surprising about how he balances truth and grace?
- 6. Read Acts 3:17–21. According to Peter, what are the results of repentance? What do you think "times of refreshing" look like in your life?
- 7. Are there areas in your life where you've been settling for "coins" instead of asking Jesus for real healing? What might it look like to bring those things to Him?
- 8. Peter sees the man. Really sees him. Who in your life might be sitting outside the gate—longing to be seen, known, or healed?
- 9. What does repentance look like practically in your current season of life? Is there something Jesus is calling you to turn from—or turn toward?
- 10. What's one thing you want to do differently this week based on this message? (It could be a prayer, a conversation, a risk of faith, or simply showing up more attentively.)
