#### **Scripture Reading Plan**

- ▶ Beginning in Acts 20:13, Paul's ministry shifted from journeys of freedom to a mission carried out in chains. Fully aware that imprisonment and suffering awaited him in Jerusalem, he still chose to follow the Spirit's leading, because he treasured the fulfillment of the Lord's calling above his own safety. Before departing, the elders of Ephesus wept as they sent him off, while Paul urged them to remain faithful in shepherding God's flock.
- ▶ Upon his arrival in Jerusalem, Paul was falsely accused in the temple, sparking a riot, and had to be rescued by Roman soldiers. Yet he boldly continued to testify to the risen Christ before the crowds and stood unafraid before the council's trial. When a plot by the Jews to kill him failed, he was transferred

- under guard to Caesarea and kept in custody.

#### **Icebreaking**

1. What is a small or simple thing you want to be more grateful for?

- 2. Please review your sermon notes for this week. What did you learn that you did not know previously?
- 3. Read together again Colossians 3:1-11. What impression does this passage give you? What is the most intriguing saying in this passage to you?
- 4. How does Colossians 3 describe the contrast between the "old self" and the "new self"?
- 5. Why does Paul use the imagery of "taking off" and "putting on" clothes when describing the Christian life?
- 6. What cultural or social divisions does Paul address, and how does the gospel transform
- How does this passage connect baptism with new life?

#### Feel

- 8. How do you feel when you hear Paul's words that your "old life is dead"? What emotions arise when you picture yourself "clothed" in Christ's new life?
- 9. Have you ever felt discouraged by your inability to be holy? How does this passage shift your feelings?
- 10. When you think of leaving behind anger, lust, or greed, do you feel fear, relief, or resistance? Why?
- 11. In what ways do you resonate with C. S. Lewis's image of being "too easily pleased" with lesser desires?
- 12. What might it look like for you to live "holy" in everyday routines (work, family, relationships)?

#### Plan

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to deliberately replace old habits with new ones that reflect Christ's resurrected life? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

#### Do

- 14. Resolve to deliberately replace old habits with new ones that reflect Christ's resurrected life. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 15. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 16. Commit to deliberately replace old habits with new ones that reflect Christ's resurrected life. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
